Discipline's description.

The selective educational component "Values of Civil Society" is aimed at forming in higher education students a holistic understanding of the essence, content and role of basic values of civil society in modern democratic development and management practice. The course reveals theoretical and applied aspects of the functioning of civil society, the relationship between man, state, business and social institutions based on common value orientations.

Particular attention is paid to the analysis of such key values as human dignity, freedom, the rule of law, democracy, social justice, solidarity, tolerance and civic responsibility, as well as the mechanisms for their implementation in the context of modern social

transformations and global challenges. Within the framework of the course, students consider the role of civil society institutions, governance ethics and social responsibility in the formation of a sustainable and open society capable of self-organization and development.

The subject of the discipline "Values of Civil Society" is a system of basic civic values, principles and norms that determine the functioning of civil society, the mechanisms of their formation and implementation, as well as their impact on social, administrative and legal processes in modern society.

The aim of the discipline is to form in higher education students a holistic understanding of the essence and meaning of the basic values of civil society, develop the ability to analyze social and managerial processes through the prism of these values, as well as acquire skills for their application in professional and civic activities.

The objectives of the discipline are aimed at forming in higher education applicants a holistic and systematic understanding of the essence, content and meaning of civil society values, their place in democratic development and modern social processes. Studying the discipline involves mastering knowledge about the theoretical foundations of the functioning of civil society, its structure, basic principles and value orientations.

Within the educational component, students gain an understanding of basic civic values, including human dignity, freedom, the rule of law, democracy, social justice, solidarity, tolerance, and civic responsibility, as well as mechanisms for their implementation in public life. Particular attention is paid to understanding the role of civil society institutions, civic participation, governance ethics, and social responsibility in ensuring stability, openness, and sustainable development of society.

In addition, the study of the discipline is aimed at developing the ability to apply the values of civil society in professional activities, developing a responsible attitude towards management decisions, and increasing the level of civic culture and legal awareness of higher education students, taking into account modern social transformations and global challenges.

As a result of studying the selective educational component "Values of Civil Society", applicants must:

Know:

- the essence, content and meaning of civil society and its place in modern social development;
- the core values of civil society, including human dignity, freedom, the rule of law, democracy, social justice, solidarity, tolerance and civic responsibility;
- principles of functioning of civil society and the role of its institutions;
- the foundations of human rights and mechanisms for their enforcement and protection in modern society;
- the importance of governance ethics and social responsibility in civil society;
- the impact of globalization processes and modern social challenges on the system of civic values.

Be able to:

- apply the values of civil society in professional, managerial and civic activities;
- express one's own position on issues of social development, human rights, and civic participation in a well-reasoned manner;

- adhere to ethical principles and standards of social responsibility in the process of making management decisions;
- use the value orientations of civil society to form constructive interaction in the team and social environment;
- implement the principles of civic engagement, tolerance, and respect for human rights and freedoms in everyday and professional practice.

Prerequisites for the discipline. The study of the educational component is based on the foundation laid during the 1st semester. To successfully master the material, higher education applicants must have knowledge about: historical processes of the formation of Ukrainian society, features of the development of national culture and the formation of civic identity, obtained during the study of the course "History and Culture of Ukraine"; about philosophical categories, values, freedom and responsibility of the individual, society and social interactions, formed within the discipline "Philosophy". In addition, the mastery of the educational component is based on the skills formed in the course "Academic Studies" to work with educational and scientific information, adhere to the principles of academic integrity, logically present one's own reasoning and participate in educational discussions.

Post-requisites for the discipline. The competencies acquired within the educational component regarding understanding the value foundations of civil society, principles of responsibility, ethics, and social interaction are the basis for studying professional disciplines of 4–8 semesters, in particular the courses "Leadership and Communications", "HR Management", and "Self-Management", in which value orientations determine the effectiveness of management activities and work with personnel.

The formed idea of social responsibility, civic activity and interaction with stakeholders is necessary for mastering specialized educational components, such as "Social Responsibility of Business", "Fundamentals of Business Management" and "Strategic Enterprise Management", and is also closely correlated with the practice-oriented components of the educational program - educational, industrial and pre-diploma practice and qualification work, within which a value-based approach to making management decisions is implemented.

Technical Equipment and Software.

The material and technical support of the educational process in the discipline "Values of Civil Society" involves the use of specialized classrooms equipped with modern technical teaching aids, as well as library funds, including electronic resources.

Multimedia equipment, including computers and a multimedia projector, is used to visualize educational material during lectures and seminars. Performing practical and independent tasks, preparing for seminars, and studying educational materials are provided by access to the Internet via free Wi-Fi coverage.

Forms and methods of assessment.

The system of assessing the knowledge of applicants includes current and final (semester) control.

Current assessment is carried out systematically during practical and seminar classes in order to check the level of mastery of theoretical foundations, the formation of diagnostic and forecasting skills, as well as the ability to use specialized software for modeling and data analysis.

Forms of student participation in the educational process that are subject to ongoing control.

Students' participation in the learning process is implemented through oral presentations, research presentations, reports based on the results of case studies, as well as active involvement in professional discussions and brainstorming sessions. The written component of the work includes the completion of control and test tasks, the preparation of essays and summaries based on lecture materials and independent study.

Methods of ongoing assessment include: The methodological tools of current control in the discipline "Values of Civil Society" combine oral and written forms of assessment.

Oral control is carried out in the form of surveys, interviews, and participation of applicants in seminar discussions.

Written assignments include individual and group assignments, short written responses, reflective essays, and case studies.

Assessment is also based on observing the activity of candidates during discussions of problematic social situations, checking the results of presentations of individual or group tasks, as well as conducting rapid testing using open-ended and closed-ended tasks.

Assessment Criteria and Procedure

Assessment of applicants' academic achievements is carried out in accordance with the current Regulations on Assessment in Higher Education Institutions.

Modular Assessment. Modular Assessment (MA) is conducted at the final lesson of the content module in the form of a written test.

When evaluating a module test, the volume and correctness of the tasks are taken into account:

- the grade “excellent” (A) is given for the correct completion of all tasks (or more than 90% of all tasks);
- a “good” (B) grade is given for completing 80% of all tasks;
- a grade of “good” (C) is given for completing 70% of all tasks;
- a grade of “satisfactory” (D) is given for the correct completion of 60% of the proposed tasks;
- a grade of “satisfactory” (E) is given if more than 50% of the proposed tasks are completed correctly;
- an “unsatisfactory” (FX) grade is given if less than 50% of the tasks are completed.

Failure to appear for a module test - 0 points.
The above scores are converted into rating points as follows:

"A" - 18-20 points;

"B" - 16-17 points;

- "C" - 14-15 points;
- "D" - 12-13 points.
- "E" - 10-11 points;
- "FX" - less than 10 points.

The final semester assessment in the discipline "Values of Civil Society" is a mandatory form of assessing students' learning outcomes. It is conducted within the time frame specified in the curriculum and covers the scope of material specified in the course program.

The final assessment is carried out in the form of a test. A student who has completed all the required work is allowed to take the semester assessment.

The final grade is based on the student's performance during the semester. The student's grade consists of points accumulated from the results of the current assessment and incentive points.

Students who have completed all required assignments and received a score of 60 points or higher receive a grade corresponding to the grade received without additional testing.

For students who have completed all the required tasks but received a score below 60 points, as well as for those who wish to improve their score (result), the teacher conducts a final work in the form of a test during the last scheduled lesson in the discipline in the academic semester.

Evaluation of Additional (Individual) Educational Activities

Additional (individual) types of educational activities include the participation of applicants in scientific conferences, scientific circles of applicants and problem groups, preparation of publications, participation in All-Ukrainian Olympiads and competitions and International competitions, etc. in excess of the tasks established by the relevant work program of the academic discipline.

By decision of the department, students who participated in research work and performed certain types of additional (individual) educational activities may be awarded incentive (bonus) points for a specific educational component.

Assessment of independent work (Maximum — 4 points)

The total number of points received by a student for completing independent work is one of the components of academic success in the discipline. Independent work on each topic, in accordance with the course program, is evaluated in the range from 0 to 4 points using standardized and generalized knowledge assessment criteria.

Forms of assessment include: ongoing assessment of students' academic performance during practical (seminar) classes, including checking the assimilation of theoretical material based on oral responses, participation in discussions, preparation of reports, reports and presentations.

Assessment also involves completing individual and group tasks, solving situational cases, preparing written papers on topics of independent study, summarizing educational material, and formulating conclusions.

The level of mastery of the educational material is monitored through testing, written tests, and final examinations. The preparation of educational and scientific materials (theses of reports, short reviews, etc.) is encouraged, which contributes to the development of skills for independent educational and professional activity.

A 100-point, national and ECTS assessment scale is used to assess the learning outcomes of a higher education student during the semester.

Discipline's Policy

Successful mastery of the educational component "Values of Civil Society" requires high self-discipline and a responsible attitude to the educational process from students. Mandatory conditions are regular attendance at lectures and practical classes, active participation in classroom work, as well as timely and high-quality completion of all types of independent and control tasks provided for by the program. In case of missing classes or obtaining unsatisfactory results, the student is obliged to eliminate academic debt by working out the relevant topics.

An integral part of the training is strict adherence to the norms of academic ethics and culture of behavior. The educational process is based on the principles of academic integrity, which implies exclusively independent performance of all written works, reports and presentations. Any borrowing of thoughts or texts of other authors must be accompanied by correct references to the original sources. Any manifestations of academic dishonesty are unacceptable within the course, in particular plagiarism, self-plagiarism, fabrication and falsification of data, copying, deception, bribery or biased evaluation.
