Discipline's description.

The educational component "Tourism and Security Management" is aimed at forming a set of knowledge and practical skills in the organization of tourism activities with a priority on the safety component. The course focuses on current forms of modern tourism (family outbound tourism, cross-border shopping tours, gastronomic and rural green tourism) in regions with a low level of risk. border (Moldova, Romania, Bulgaria), the logistics of weekend tours and the algorithms of the manager's actions in non-standard situations.

The subject of the discipline is managerial relations, organizational processes and technologies of ensuring security that arise during the formation, promotion and sale of tourist products in modern conditions.

The aim of the discipline is to form a system of professional competencies for the effective management of tourism enterprises, the development of safe tourist routes and minimization of risks to the life and health of tourists during travel.

The objectives of the discipline are to study the regulatory framework for tourism security, master the methodology for assessing the risks of border areas and acquire skills in logistics planning of family and specialized tours. Students should learn how to design safe tourism products, organize support for vulnerable groups of tourists and implement digital security monitoring tools in the tourism business.

As a result of studying the selective educational component "Tourism and Security Management", applicants must:

Know:

- the specifics of organizing outbound tourism to border countries (Moldova, Romania, Bulgaria);
- requirements for the safety of children's recreation and recreation;
- features of management of local types of tourism (gastro-, green, shopping tourism);
- Algorithms of anti-crisis management in the tourism industry..

be able to:

- instruct tourists on the rules of conduct and safety abroad;
- carry out logistical calculation and support of outbound group trips;
- assess the potential risks of tourist destinations;
- use mobile applications and online services to coordinate the safety of tourist groups.

Prerequisites for the discipline. The study of the discipline in the 5th semester is based on the knowledge and skills acquired in the course of mastering the compulsory disciplines of the previous semesters: Jurisprudence, Management, Enterprise Economics, Digital Technologies in Management, Foreign Language.

Post-requisites for the discipline. The acquired competencies become the basis for further study of such disciplines as Fundamentals of Entrepreneurship, Fundamentals of Business Management, Logistics Management, Strategic Management of Enterprise, as well as provide preparation of students for professional practice and writing term papers and diploma papers related to service activities and management in the field of services.

Technical Equipment and Software.

Material and technical support of the educational process involves the use of specialized classrooms and library funds. Multimedia equipment (projector, computer) is used to visualize the educational material during lectures and seminars. Practical tasks and in-depth study of topics are provided by access to the Internet via free Wi-Fi coverage. Additionally, it is planned to use cloud services for teamwork (for example, Trello or Notion), specialized software for financial modeling, as well as artificial intelligence tools for conducting market research and assessing the potential of innovative projects.

Forms and methods of assessment.

The system of assessment of applicants' knowledge includes current and final (semester) control.

Current assessment is carried out systematically during practical and seminar classes in order to check the level of assimilation of theoretical foundations, the formation of diagnostic and forecasting skills, as well as the ability to use specialized software for modeling and data analysis.

Forms of student participation in the educational process that are subject to ongoing control.

Students' participation in the educational process is realized through oral presentations, presentations of analytical research, reports on the results of case studies, as well as active involvement in professional discussions and brainstorming. The written component of the work includes the performance of control and test tasks, the preparation of analytical notes, abstracts and notes based on the materials of lectures and independent study.

Methods of ongoing assessment include: The methodological tools of control combine oral forms (surveys, interviews) and written types of work (reports, calculation tasks, building models). The assessment is also based on observing the activity of applicants in solving problem situations, checking the results of the presentation of individual projects, and conducting testing with open and closed types of tasks.

Assessment Criteria and Procedure

Assessment of students' educational achievements is carried out in accordance with the current Regulations on Assessment in a Higher Education Institution.

Modular Assessment. Modular Assessment (MA) is carried out at the final lesson of each content block in the form of written testing.

When evaluating the unit test, the volume and correctness of the tasks are taken into account:

- grade "excellent" (A) is given for the correct completion of all tasks (or more than 90% of all tasks);
- grade "good" (B) is given for completing 80% of all tasks;
- grade "good" (C) is given for completing 70% of all tasks;
- the grade "satisfactory" (D) is given for the correct completion of 60% of the proposed tasks;
- the grade "satisfactory" (E) is given if more than 50% of the proposed tasks are correctly completed;
- An "unsatisfactory" (FX) rating is given if less than 50% of the tasks are completed.
- Failure to appear for the unit test - 0 points.

The above scores are converted into rating points as follows:

"A" - 18-20 points;

"B" - 16-17 points;

"C" - 14-15 points;

"D" - 12-13 points.

"E" - 10-11 points;

"FX" - less than 10 points.

The final semester assessment in the discipline "Tourism and Security Management" is a mandatory form of assessment of students' learning outcomes. It is carried out within the terms determined by the curriculum and covers the amount of material determined by the course program.

The final assessment is carried out in the form of a test. A student who has completed all the necessary work is admitted to the semester assessment.

The final grade is given based on the student's learning outcomes during the semester. The student's assessment consists of points accumulated from the results of the current assessment and incentive points.

Students who have completed all the required tasks and received a score of 60 points or higher receive a grade corresponding to the grade received, without additional testing.

For students who have completed all the necessary tasks, but received a score below 60 points, as well as for those who want to improve their score (result), the teacher conducts the final work in the form of a test during the last scheduled lesson in the discipline in the academic semester.

Evaluation of Additional (Individual) Educational Activities

Additional (individual) types of educational activities include the participation of applicants in the work of scientific conferences, scientific circles of applicants and problem groups, preparation of publications, participation in All-Ukrainian Olympiads and competitions and International competitions, etc., in excess of the scope of tasks that are established by the relevant work program of the academic discipline.

By the decision of the department, students who participated in research work and performed certain types of additional (individual) types of educational activities can be awarded incentive (bonus) points for a certain educational component.

Assessment of independent work (Maximum — 4 points)

The total number of points received by a student for independent work is one of the components of academic success in the discipline. Independent work on each topic, according to the course program, is evaluated in the range from 0 to 4 points using standardized and generalized criteria for assessing knowledge.

Forms of assessment include: current assessment of practical work; current assessment of knowledge acquisition based on oral answers, reports, presentations and other forms of participation during practical (seminar) classes; individual or group projects that require the development of practical skills and competencies (optional format); solving situational problems; preparation of resumes on independently studied topics; testing or written exams; preparation of draft articles, conference abstracts and other publications; other forms that ensure a comprehensive assimilation of the curriculum and contribute to the gradual development of skills for effective independent professional (practical, scientific and theoretical) activities at a high level.

To assess the learning outcomes of a higher education applicant during the semester, a 100-point, national and ECTS assessment scale is used

Discipline's Policy

Mastering the discipline "Tourism and Security Management" requires students to have a high level of self-organization, empathy and readiness to make responsible management decisions. The educational process in the 5th semester is built on the principles of active interaction, so regular attendance at classes is mandatory for mastering safety algorithms and rules for accompanying tourist groups. Students should take an active part in modeling outbound tours, developing weekend itineraries, and analyzing crisis situations that arise during travel. Timely completion of practical tasks and presentation of your own security checklists are a prerequisite for successful completion of the course. In case of missing classes, the applicant must independently work through the theoretical material and prepare an analytical analysis of the missed topic to confirm knowledge of minimizing risks in tourism.

The activities of the future tourism manager are based on strict adherence to the norms of professional ethics and academic integrity. Applicants must independently develop logistics schemes for shopping tours, conduct a safety audit of tourist destinations and form author's gastronomic routes. When using statistical data, cartographic materials or regulations of border countries (Romania, Moldova, Bulgaria), it is mandatory to provide correct references to primary sources.

Within the framework of the study of the course, any manifestations of academic dishonesty are strictly prohibited, in particular, plagiarism in the projects of tourist routes, copying tour programs from commercial sites without their processing and analysis, as well as fabrication of data on security conditions in the regions. It is unacceptable to cheat during testing, use third-party assistance in solving situational problems on the test or unauthorized generation of analytical reports using artificial intelligence without properly indicating its role. Any violation of the principles of integrity leads to the cancellation of points for the relevant work without the right to retake it, which is in line with the general policy of the institution regarding the formation of an honest educational environment.
